LUKE MURPHY MP

It's just over a year since I've been elected as your MP. In the last year we've had over 7,000 casework or policy queries from constituents. In the coming months and years I will continue to work hard locally as your constituency MP to be visible, accessible, and deliver on the promise of change that you voted for a year ago.

Basingstoke still doesn't have a town centre Post Office – and you deserve answers! I have written again to the CEO of the Post Office after another delay to the promised new branch in the town centre. We were told it would open in April. Then July. Then August. Now it's October.

St Michael's Hospice will receive more than $\pounds 258,000$ as part of the government's $\pounds 75m$ investment in end-of-life care, the largest ever for hospices in England!

The macular unit we lost at Kempshott Sainsbury's is returning to Basingstoke. Everything is now in

place for it to be stationed at the Leisure Park regularly. I have spoken to residents about this from day one of being elected and made representations to the Frimley NHS Foundation Trust, the ICB, and the Council to get it reinstated. I'm delighted that this vital service is coming back where it belongs.

In July I met with heat pump installers, fuel poverty campaigners and environmental charities in Parliament to back a simple but urgent goal: cutting electricity prices.

The UK has some of the highest electricity costs in Europe. Too many families are still facing eyewatering bills - and the switch to cleaner, more efficient heating must be made easier and more affordable.

This autumn: Luke will be undertaking two charity fundraising events.

In his first event, Luke will be abseiling down the Spinnaker Tower in Portsmouth, raising money for the Basingstoke MS Community Group, which provides vital support for people living with multiple sclerosis and their families. This was scheduled for August, so by the time you get to read this, he'll have probably done it.

In September, Luke will be skydiving at Netheravon Airfield, raising money for the Hampshire Hospitals Charity in support of the amazing team at Hampshire Hospitals NHS Trust's Firvale Unit, which provides specialist paediatric care and vital support to families of children with life-limiting and complex health needs.

COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Since my last article in June, I am pleased to report that Newman Court Day Centre will remain open until a new service provider has been found. Hampshire County Council had wanted to close it to save £250,000 a year, but at a meeting of its Health and Adult Social Care Committee on July 16th, the Director of Adult Health and Care gave an assurance that the Day Centre would be kept open until a new provider is found. I'd like to thank all the staff, their union, residents, councillors, and Luke Murphy MP, for everything done to help secure a great result!

The council has been consulting on a draft update to their Climate Change and Air Quality strategy. Basically, they want to relax the target for a carbon-neutral Borough from 2030 to 2045. This at a time when the Government is pressing ahead with accelerating decarbonisation with a target to double onshore wind, triple solar power, and quadruple offshore wind by 2030, with almost all electricity generation decarbonised. The council is clearly going in the wrong direction: we have just three years to limit temperature rises to 1.5C. To

cap it all, planning permission was refused for a 39 hectare solar farm which would have generated enough electricity for Brighton Hill, Harrow Way and the Viables Industrial Estate. Instead we'll pay through the nose for foreign oil and gas to generate our electricity.

The local government re-organisation continues. Basingstoke and Deane are working with ten other councils to draw up proposals for five unitary authorities to replace the existing fifteen in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. Hampshire County Council has other ideas, it wants larger councils. There will be an extraordinary meeting of Basingstoke and Deane on 25th September to pass a submission to government the following day. We are likely to hear a decision around March 2026 with elections in May 2027 and the new councils starting up in April 2028.

System Improvements in place and planned

The practice is moving very quickly, but in a very controlled way to improve its systems. It would not be sensible to change all processes at once.

There is now only one Phone number in use for any of the four surgeries 01256 479747. With an improved switchboard system and with 4 staff vacancies filled call waits are now down to 11 minutes on average, which is a huge improvement. The 'Pharmacy team' call takers are most pressed with calls around 10 am so if you can avoid that time, you'll get through quicker with less pressure on the system.

Appointments - Urgent matters are being dealt with faster, but for less urgent matters appointments are not always available. We know that requests for appointments are greater than the number of appointments available, but GP staffing levels are fixed and staffing is in line with NHS levels.

To make more appointments available to those who need to see a GP, the practice has run two pilot days of a new **Doctor lead Triage system**. This relies on patients providing a summary of their need for an appointment online, at reception desk or by phone. This is then passed to the Triage Doctor who allocates the most appropriate resource for the patients need. The results of these tests were very promising, with many enquiries dealt with immediately by the triage doctor without the need for an appointment, or routed to more appropriate clinicians, freeing up appointments for those who need them.

Simple matters can often be dealt with through the use of the online system. Even when triage is closed nurses appointments and admin matters can still be dealt with through the Dr IQ Evergreen app. There will be further testing of the new triage system and then it will be explained to patients and launched at the end of the summer.

BRIGHTON HILL CUB PACK

Probably the most memorable activity of the spring term was a coach trip to London at the end of March. Cubs suggested the trip and helped to select exactly where we would go. Leaving Basingstoke at 8am promptly, we arrived at the Natural History Museum in time for opening and were the first group into the large mammal gallery which enabled the Cubs to really appreciate the size and splendour of the Blue Whale skeleton on display. After that we went to the dinosaur exhibition and then onto the earth galleries where Cubs were able to experience an earthquake tremor. After lunch we walked to the Science Museum, where we had booked a session in 'Launch Pad', the interactive zone. Cubs were able to independently explore this area finding out about planet movements. shadows, gravity, aerodynamics and lots more. Boarding the coach, we travelled across London for our evening flight on the London Eye where Cubs were able to pick out various landmarks including St. Pauls Cathedral, The Houses of Parliament and Buckingham Palace. Before we had even boarded the coach to return home, Cubs were planning what we would do on our next trip to the capital!

One of the badges we worked on during our regular Thursday meetings was the air activities; this required Cubs to make and fly paper planes, design their own aircraft and learn how to write their name using the phonetic alphabet. An evening visit to the top of town gave Cubs the chance to find out about some to the famous people and events associated with the town.

Italy was the featured country for the International badge, Cubs spent an evening sewing stockings for the Italian festival of La Befana. On the eve of Epiphany, a good witch visits homes and fills the stockings with sweets - a custom enjoyed by many Italian children and also appreciated by the Cubs when they received their stockings filled with sweets.

15 Cubs attended the first night of the Gangshow at the Haymarket Theatre, 23 went on visits to

the Apple store and a similar number went on a short evening hike stopping at the chip shop and playground. 8 of the oldest Cubs were invited to a night hike at Tadley, an extremely muddy affair but enjoyed by those who took part, even the one whose entire shoe was left in the mud as he walked forward. Another popular event was the gaming session at QMC, this was also suggested by the Cubs.

Having just enjoyed a tomahawk throwing evening, Cubs are now looking forward to an activity day, a water sports day and camp before the summer term ends.

RECIPES (using autumn produce)

ROASTED BUTTERNUT SQUASH AND PEPPER SOUP

Ingredients:1 onion (peeled and sliced), 1 medium butternut squash (peeled, deseeded and cut into cubes), 1 red pepper (washed, deseeded and cut into chunks), 2 garlic cloves (peeled and crushed), 1 medium potato (peeled and cut into small pieces), little oil, 1 litre vegetable stock, seasoning of choice (eg. salt, pepper, nutmeg).

- Toss the butternut squash and pepper in a little oil and roast in a hot oven until starting to brown.
- Meanwhile, place the onion, potato, garlic, vegetable stock and seasoning in a saucepan and simmer for 15 minutes.
- 3. Add the roasted butternut squash and pepper and simmer for 10 minutes.
- Using a hand blender or food processor, blend until smooth and serve (adjusting seasoning if necessary).

COUSCOUS WITH ROASTED VEGETABLES

Ingredients: 1 cooked, peeled beetroot, 2 parsnips, 2 carrots, 2 red onions, I pepper, 1 tablsp. olive oil, 2 teasp. mixed herbs, 100g couscous, 200ml vegetable stock, 1 tablsp. chopped nuts, 2 apples (cored and chopped).

1. Pre-heat oven to 200c, gas reg 6

(serves 2-3)

- Peel and cut the root vegetables into chunks, de-seed the pepper and cut into chunks, prepare and slice the onions. Put on a baking tray, drizzle over the oil and sprinkle the herbs over. Roast for about 25 minutes.
- Put the couscous in a pan with the stock, bring to the boil, remove from the heat, cover and let it stand for 5 minutes or until the stock has been absorbed.
- 4. in a dish, stir the roast vegetables and couscous together. Top with the nuts and chopped apple. Eat hot or cold.

(You can make this dish with any variety of vegetables, seeds and nuts)

SPICY BAKED APPLES (serves 4)

Ingredients: 4 Bramley apples (each about 220g), 4 heaped tbsp. mincemeat, 4 tbsp maple syrup, a little muscovado sugar.

- 1. Pre-heat oven to 180C/gas 4
- Using the tip of a sharp knife, mark a circle round each apple to avoid the skins splitting. Cut out the core and place the apples snugly in a baking dish.
- Stuff each core of the apples with mincemeat, drizzle the syrup over and scatter sugar on top.
- 4. Bake for 40-45 minutes, basting them halfway through.
- Cool slightly, then serve covered with the syrupy juices and maybe ice-cream or custard.

GARDENS IN AUTUMN

We hope that you had an enjoyable summer and that your gardens and allotments have recovered from the excessive heat and little rain. Most wellestablished perennial plants will have survived but it was hard work keeping annuals and vegetables watered especially when we had a hose pipe ban. Hopefully by now you will have been harvesting crops such as tomatoes, courgettes, sweetcorn, carrots, beans, potatoes, peppers. It's been a brilliant year for enjoying a variety of soft fruit. Plums, apples, pears and nuts are in abundance and should be ready for harvesting soon. If you have not grown your own produce, please buy British whilst it's in season as it is tastier and fresher and will not be in the shops for long. Excess produce can be used to make chutney, jam, pickles, crumbles, pies or cakes. Try to include vegetables and fruit in main meals to make them tasty and healthy.

Many summer annuals and perennials will still be flowering well into September and October especially fuchsias which prefer cooler conditions. Autumn flowering plants such as cyclamen, nerines, sedums, Japanese anemones and Michaelmas daisies are beautiful along with the foliage of acers, berries of cotoneasters, hollies and rowans.

Unfortunately we can't just sit back and relax for long as there is work to be done! Collect ripe seeds from favourite plants and keep them dry for sowing next year. Remove dead annual plants and weeds, then dig over the ground, applying compost/manure. As it gets colder, lift tender perennials to store in the greenhouse. Try to keep the garden tidy but remember to leave heaps of leaves for hibernating hedgehogs. Greenhouses should be thoroughly cleaned to reduce chances of harbouring pests and fungal diseases.

Lawns will need some TLC after the dry spring and summer so rake out any thatch and debris and spike to aerate the ground. You can also apply some autumn feed to help strengthen roots. For the last cut of the year, lift the lawnmower blades so as not to cut the grass too short.

Autumn is the time to plant out spring bulbs, wallflowers, pansies, primroses, rockery plants, trees, shrubs, roses and spring cabbages.

Enjoy the spectacular autumn colours, in your garden, in local parks and our beautiful countryside and also delicious home grown produce.




